Program Information

Introduction

Delhi Skill and Entrepreneurship University's undergraduate BA (Spanish) program will prepare students for professional positions that include Spanish-speaking skills and cultural competency. This course will improve their knowledge of Spanish and introduce them to the vibrant culture of the Spanish-speaking world. The course will prepare students in charting an international career as cultural exchange experts, translators, teachers, BPO professionals and so on.

Program Objectives

A degree in BA (Spanish) at DSEU would provide students with in-depth training in language, literature, linguistics, and culture. The cultural classes will expose and familiarize students with the major Spanish-speaking countries; their art, history, politics, music, and social trends. Students in literature classes will read key works by a variety of writers, strengthen their linguistic and analytical skills, and examine a wide range of cultural and social topics.

The students would also have opportunities of specialization as they learn the linguistic, literary, and cultural elements of the Spanish language in Spanish literature, mass media, politics, and film.

The program offers flexible entry and exit opportunities to students who can choose to exit after the first year of the program with a Diploma, after the second year with an Advanced Diploma, or complete the full three years and exit with a Degree.

There are three courses that will cut across all the degree programmes:

- a. Face the World (FTW) courses aimed at imparting twenty-first century skills among the learners that will cover Digital Literacy, Financial Literacy, Socio-emotional skills, Professional Workplace Behaviour and Entrepreneurial mindset to name a few.
- b. English Communication I and English Communication II as prescribed by UGC under Ability Enhancement courses.
- c. Environmental Studies (EVS) and Disaster Management as prescribed by UGC under Ability Enhancement courses.

Pedagogy and Teaching Methodology

The pedagogy will be based on the SWIRRL approach, which emphasizes the development of skills in Speaking, Writing, Interaction, Reading, Role Plays, and Listening. The emphasis would be to ensure a strong communication and fluency in speaking Spanish. Besides, the students would also get opportunities of immersion in Spanish speaking cultures.

Placement and Internship

This programme will lead students to diverse career tracks as translators, travel agent, immigration officer roles, social worker, educator in various sectors like business, government, education, tourism, and social services.
